# **RECYCLING MADE EASY**

You can recycle grocery packaging containers made of plastic, glass, metal and cardboard. Simply empty and rinse all your containers and place them loose in your recycling bin, together with flattened paper and cardboard from your home.

- No soft plastics they get caught in the sorting machines. You can drop these to collection points at local participating retailers.
- Wondering what items can go in the recycling bin?





#### **Please note:**

- All recyclable items need to be larger than 50mm x 50mm, but smaller than 4-litres.
- Empty and rinse all recyclable items and place loose in your recycling bin.
- Put all lids in your rubbish bin.
